Officiating at a race meeting is a good way to get close to the action and see some great racing. Many invaluable volunteers come together to make race meetings possible: Scrutineers, Flag Marshalls, Fire Marshalls, Timekeepers, Communicators and Paddock Marshalls. Many roles require accreditation, depending on the level of responsibility of the job.

For some specific roles, organisations have been setup to help train and organise officials. Prominent examples are the [Victorian Flag Marshalls Team](#) and [Victorian Fire & Rescue Squad](#). The best way to get involved as an official is to join a CAMS affiliated car club, or one of the organisations mentioned above. Most car clubs are involved in the running of some form of motorsport event.

The VSCRC is run by the Victorian Mini Club Inc, the Australian Sports Sedan Association (Vic), the MG Car Club and the Phillip Island Auto Racing Club. Volunteers are always welcome.

Officials

Becoming a motorsport official is the best way of getting close to the action without being in the drivers seat. Volunteer officials are instrumental in enabling motorsport to take place. Officials ensure that events are conducted safely, fairly and that the rules and regulations are upheld.
